A renowned worker rights advocate and our keynote speaker, **Dr. Gerard Ayers**, OHS & E Manager, C & G Division CFMEU Victorian Branch from the Australia's largest construction union visits ECU. He will engage us in a discussion around awareness and action of these issues in preparation for **International Workers' Memorial Day (IWMD)**, which takes place annually around the world on April 28. IWMD is a day of remembrance and action for workers killed, disabled, injured or made unwell by their work.
